LOT 67A A Chadburns brass R P M indicator, the signed brass dial calculated to 1440 RPM in a red painted and polished case, 32cm diameter.

LOT 67B A Chadburns brass R P M indicator, the signed brass dial calculated to 1440 RPM in a red painted and polished case, 32cm diameter.

LOT 121A A Greenwich Centennial Maritime mantel clock, the ship finial above gilt and silver plated terrestrial globe with brass meridian and equator rings, silvered chapter rings with Roman numerals raised on a cylindrical double barrel movement supported by three gilt mermaid figures, stamped 'St James House Co. London No. 151 of 1500' the whole supported on an oak socle on scroll feet, 38cm high.

LOT 182A A cased scale model of the Clipper Thermopylae, standing and running rigged above decorated deck painted blue to waterline and simulated copper plating below, within a glazed case, 61 x 92 x 31 cm.

** Built in 1868 by Walter Hood of Aberdeen Thermopylae set the speed record on her maiden voyage to Melbourne of 63 days, still the fastest trip under sail*

Estimate £150 -250

LOT182B A remote control scale model of the tug 'Nina III' 75cm length.

LOT 331 Should Read A three piece silver cruet set of octagonal shape, Birmingham 1958, also a pierced silver pepper and matching salt Birmingham 1922/23, an oval Continental silver salt , with pierced decoration, a plated pear shaped pepper, a plated two handled cup and cover, and a plated circular swing handled fruit basket,weight of silver 3.75ozs (9).

LOT 548 Should Read A 19th century Dutch treadle operated spinning wheel,.....

LOT 571 Should Read An Arts & Crafts oak cased aneroid barometer and thermometer, the dial stamped R. Bailey, 14 & 15 Bennetts Hill Birmingham, the shaped case with brass inlaid stylised tulip designs and strung border, 79cm high.

LOT 586 Should Read A Turkey runner, the shaded red field with a row of geometric medallions enclosed by a main powder blue geometric meander border 392cm x 116cm.

LOT 588 Should Read A near matching Turkey runner, 330cm x 120cm.
